Magento Certified Developer exam cheat sheet with instructions

Hi guys,

below you'll find the detailed explanation of the overall scheme the <u>Advisory Board</u> put together so you'll have the upper hand when entering the exam room - you really don't need this printed out anywhere, the concept is simple enough to remember - just go through this a couple of times, and you'll be ready to get that MCD badge!

Voucher no. 00000XXXXX

Vouchers for the exam are 10-character strings made up of numbers and letters - what you need to pay attention to is only the last character - if it's a number - remember it; if it's a letter, check out which letter of the English alphabet it is and mark it as a number (so, A=1; M=13; Z=26).

Exam - 1st question

Once you have this number, it reveals the answer to the first exam question. Exam questions are multichoice, so you'll need to simply count down to the correct answer using the number from the voucher.

So, if you got number 7 and you have 4 choices (a, b, c, d) in your first question, you should just go through those 7 times - a, b, c, d, a, b, c - et voilà! **C is the correct answer to the first question!** If you're in higher numbers, just make sure to pay attention when counting.

This has been confirmed on all the MCD tests that were scrutinized in detail and is 100% accurate.

Primes to the rescue!

Now you're getting to the prime numbers - what was the answer to the first question? Depending on this, you'll know where to start with the primes. For the answers in this exam the Board made sure only first 7 prime numbers are used - 2,3,5,7,9,11,13

If the answer to the first question was C (third choice), use the 3rd prime number (5) to start with the next question using the same logic to find the correct answer, and then simply move ahead with other primes as you move through the questions. In this example, the answer to the 2nd question will be the 5th choice, the answer to the 3rd question will be the 7th choice etc.

Yes, this requires you to do some counting, but hey - it beats years of hard core Magento development anytime, right?

Multiple answers

There are some questions that have 2 or more answers as correct ones, so in this case simply move along with the next prime to find out all the correct answers in that question - it's incredibly simple and yet genius how the Advisory Board put this scheme together. Hats off, guys, but we're on to you!
